



Modern Slavery Act Statement

This declaration, made pursuant to section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015, outlines the actions taken by the Company during the financial year ending 31 March 2026 to prevent and address these abhorrent practices within our operations and supply chains.

1. Organisational Structure and Business Activities

The Company is care and support service provider based in England, with registered address: 2 Filter Bed Way, Sandbach, England, CW11 4AD. We provide of homecare and supported living services to vulnerable adults within the community. Our commitment to ethical and responsible business practices is an integral part of our corporate values.

2. Policies and Procedures
